**AirBNB In Homestead** By Mike Winstead

Perhaps many of you are not aware we have a short term rental house in our neighborhood 904 Hillview Blvd. Many of our neighbors attended a required training to meet qualifications to implement a Neighborhood Watch Program. With the focus on implementing this program, we are to look out for the health and safety of our neighbors. We received tips such as:" See something. Say Something". This property creates a dilemma for "watchers" when we constantly have renters in and out and cars are always different. Suddenly, we no longer know our "neighbors".

With the new ordinance passed by City Council in January 2019, there are many rules. They are:

- No more than two rentals in seven days, and a maximum of three people to a bedroom.
- One car is allotted per bedroom and there is to be one off-street parking spot per bedroom.
- Owners must maintain a one million dollar liability insurance policy.
- Permits must be renewed every five years; extensions will be granted if no violations occur.

I have witnessed as many as eight cars parked overnight. The house next to me has been a short term rental for about seven months. I am against short term rentals; property values will decline, especially for nearby neighbors. You can be assured I will call the city if I see infractions. Neighbors, if you see infractions, please report them to the City. Finally, if you plan to sell your property in the future, will you need to declare an AirBNB in your community?

# Household Discards and Lawn Debris

Few Homesteaders would argue about our neighborhood being one of the best in Virginia Beach or even the whole U.S. It is peaceful, safe and attractive. Frequently, visitors comment on Homestead's "Norman Rockwell" appearance. However, occasionally, a few forget about keeping Homestead neat and clean looking.

Usually, such lapses occur when someone places household discards and/or lawn debris at the

curb before either Thursday night or Friday morning. Discarded household items are unsightly and when they appear curbside on Saturday or Sunday for a Friday collection, some folks become irritated at having to look at them. They really don't want to see that junk all week. Yard waste at the curb before Friday morning can also be an irritant.

It's a beautiful day — the sun is shining, the birds are chirping. What could be more perfect than a bike ride? But wait! Before you pull your bike out of the garage, let's find out how to stay safe on two wheels.

Bike riding is a lot of fun, but accidents happen. The safest way to use your bike is for transportation, not play. Every year, about 300,000 kids go to the emergency department because of bike injuries, and at least 10,000 kids have injuries that require a few days in the hospital. Some of these injuries are so serious that children die, usually from head injuries.
