

Neighborhood Watch Block Captains By Gary Medlin

Homestead is a Neighborhood Watch neighborhood. We achieved Watch status when more than 50% of us agreed to keep alert to activities in our neighborhood and to call the police at 385-5000 if we observe anything suspicious. In other words, we agreed to watch out for each other. Another requirement was that 15% of homes had to have someone trained by the police. We had 19% trained. Finally, all homes had to be assigned Block Captains.

Captains act as liaisons between residents and the Neighborhood Watch coordinator, hand out crime prevention literature, and act as crime prevention resources. The following individuals have agreed to serve as your Block Captains.

Can I park my recreational
equipment (RV, boat, jet ski,
camper, etc.) at my residence?

Excerpts from Section 16-4.2 Parking and storage of recreational equipment. Zoning Ordinance of the Virginia Beach City Code:

Such equipment shall be parked or stored within a building, or behind every plane of a structure that is substantially parallel to and facing the public right of way. *

They cannot be parked on an empty residential lot.

They cannot be parked in the public street or right-of-way for more than three hours.

You may not use recreational equipment for living, sleeping, or house keeping, except in locations lawfully established for such use.

*Basically, it has to be parked behind the front of the house.

Proposed Change to ByLaws By Karen Nuszkiewicz

Proposed Change: That the Addendum paragraph (below) be deleted in its entirety, and the Homestead boundaries map be placed in its stead.

"These published ByLaws of the Homestead Civic League omit the Addendum. The addendum is available only to members of the Homestead Civic League."

The Addendum is the map found in your hardcopy Neighborhood Directory. Historically, that map has been available to civic league members only, and it is not available in the online ByLaws document.

Why Make the Change?

Technological advances - digital maps are instantly available.

No justification for trying to keep the neighborhood's boundaries a secret.

Prospective buyers can see what homes are part of Homestead. Two houses for sale on N side of Old Providence advertised as being part of Homestead Subdivision although they are not. I've also seen listings, in the Saturday real estate sales section, of homes listed as being in Homestead but they're nowhere near our zip code! Prospective buyers or other interested parties would be able to verify that a property is located in Homestead.

Having been duly announced and published, members will vote on the proposed change on July 10th.
