Wanted: Neighborhood Watch Coordinator

Are you interested in crime prevention? Would you like to know your neighbors better? Do you want to serve your community? If you answered "yes" to all or any of these questions, you may be interested in the Neighborhood Watch position for Homestead.

Neighborhood Watch is a program that helps prevent neighborhood crime. It involves neighborhood and police cooperation. Police involvement is provided by a specific Watch liaison officer who is assigned to our neighborhood.

To be an official Watch neighborhood at least 60% percent of homes must have a resident who agrees to be a watcher. Watchers agree to be aware of their surroundings and if they see suspicious activity, to alert the police by calling the

non-emergency number 757-385-5000 (unless they witness an emergency at which time they call 911). A list of watchers is maintained by the Watch coordinator.

In addition to maintaining the Watch list, the Watch coordinator acts as a liaison between the neighborhood and the police. There are a few other duties and the retiring Watch coordinator, Gary Medlin, will provide detailed information to anyone interested in the Neighborhood Watch position. The total time commitment seldom exceeds one to one and a half hours per month.

Valentine's day Oreo M&m's cookies

Ingredients

- ½ cup butter (softened)
- ½ cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1 egg
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 & 1/3 cup flour
- 1 tablespoon corn starch
- ½ tsp baking soda
- ½ tsp salt
- 3/3 cup Valentine's day m&m's
- 7 Oreo cookies roughly
- chopped, regular stuffed

Instructions

- · Preheat the oven to 350F
- · Line a baking sheet with parchment paper
- In a medium bowl, cream the butter and both sugars together
- · Add in the vanilla and egg. Mix until smooth and well incorporated
- Add dry ingredients into wet ingredient mixture, starting with the flour, corn starch, baking soda, and salt.
- Fold in the M&M's, and Oreo pieces
- Scoop the cookie dough to create 10 equal cookies
- Place them on the prepared baking sheet and bake for 13 minutes
- Cool on the cookie sheet for 5 minutes then transfer to a cooling rack.
